

Jesus performed 37 recorded miracles in the Gospels, demonstrating His divine authority over nature, illness, and death, and revealing His compassion and power.

Overview

The 37 miracles of Jesus, as recorded in the four Gospels, include **healing the sick, casting out demons, controlling nature, and raising the dead**. Each miracle serves as a “sign” of His identity as the Messiah and illustrates His authority and compassion. They are often presented in **chronological order** to show the progression of His ministry and the growing recognition of His divine power.
